

Retirement Interest Only (RIO) Fact Sheet

This fact sheet is to provide you with a summary of important information your mortgage advisor will have talked to you about when you discussed your mortgage requirements. If you are unclear about anything listed within this fact sheet, please speak to your mortgage advisor or solicitor.

Loan Purpose	
Debt consolidation	If you have applied to take out a mortgage and use some of the advance to repay existing debts, you may well reduce your monthly outgoings initially but it may cost you more in the long term. If you have had payment difficulties with existing creditors, it may be more appropriate to speak to them and come to an arrangement than take out a new mortgage. The Society will only allow one application for debt consolidation and any future request will be declined.
Capital raising	A mortgage is a long term commitment. If you have applied for a loan to release capital for personal use, you will be required to make monthly mortgage repayments for the term of the loan.

Loan Repayment	
Interest only	A RIO mortgage is set up on an interest only basis. Interest only means your mortgage payments only go towards the interest charged – you don't actually repay any of the money you originally borrowed (the capital). You will be required to repay the mortgage on the occurrence of the earlier of the following life events: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Death - Leaving the property with no reasonable prospect of returning (e.g. moving into residential care) - Acquiring another property to use as your main residence - Selling the property without transferring the loan to a new property For joint borrowers, the life event is triggered by the surviving borrower.
Lifetime Mortgage	A RIO mortgage is not classified as a Lifetime Mortgage and does not therefore have a negative equity guarantee. Negative equity can occur following a severe and prolonged drop in UK house prices and a borrower being unable to meet their mortgage repayments. Should the loan exceed the sale value of the house, then the balance of the remaining loan will still need to be paid, for example from savings or your estate to repay the mortgage. A Lifetime Mortgage may be available and more appropriate for your personal circumstances. No negative equity is usually guaranteed with equity release products, however advice should be sought.
Repayments	Your ability to keep up with the mortgage payments may be affected if your income reduces, your outgoings increase or interest rates rise. As a RIO mortgage is a long-term commitment, you should consider how this mortgage may impact your ability to afford any potential future needs, for example, any additional care in your lifetime.
Sale of property	The proceeds from the sale of your home will be used to repay your mortgage. This will reduce the value of your estate and the amount which your beneficiaries may inherit. We would recommend that you talk to your family, or others, who may benefit from your estate about your decision to take out this mortgage.

Changes to Your Personal Circumstances	
Residential care/sheltered accommodation	This mortgage becomes repayable when you (or for joint applications, the surviving borrower) leaves the property with no reasonable prospect of returning (i.e. moving into residential care).
Death	This mortgage becomes repayable when you (or for joint applications, the surviving borrower) dies.
Acquiring another property	This mortgage becomes repayable should you acquire another property to be used as your main residence.
Portability	If you wish to move to another property, then we may consider transferring the product to the new house. The decision to do this will depend upon such factors as affordability, the loan to value ratio and whether we have such products available at that time.
Adult occupier	Should another party move into the property during the term of the mortgage (for example on marriage or the formation of a civil partnership or where a family member is acting as a carer), this may affect their right to occupy the property in the event that you die and the property needs to be sold to repay the mortgage.
Entitlement to benefits	Taking this mortgage may affect your tax position and entitlement to benefits. You may wish to seek further information from HM Revenue and Customs, Benefits Agency or another source of advice such as the Citizens Advice Bureau.

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Changes to Your Personal Circumstances (continued)	
Lasting Power of Attorney	A Lasting Power of Attorney (LPA) is a legal tool that allows you to appoint someone to make certain decisions on your behalf. The appointed person can manage your finances for you in the future if you reach a point where you are no longer able to make decisions for yourself. This is essential to ensure the mortgage payments and other aspects of your finances can continue to be dealt with in the event you lose your mental capacity during the term of the mortgage. The Society would ask you to discuss this with your solicitor or alternatively, can refer you through to our partner, Accord Legal Services, who can help you put an LPA in place if you haven't done so already.
Wills	You may wish to consider reviewing your Will, or taking out a Will if you do not have one in place already.
Life Assurance	Although Life Assurance is not compulsory, you may want to consider this.
Independent legal advice	You may want to consider taking independent legal advice before entering into a mortgage contract, to make sure that you fully understand the terms of the mortgage and any possible future implications.
